New home groups starting.

At St John's we are planning a number of small groups to meet regularly in homes around the parish and beyond. Ecclesiastes 1.2,12-14; 2.18-23

Vanity of vanities, says the Teacher, vanity of vanities! All is vanity.

I, the Teacher, when king over Israel in Jerusalem, applied my mind to seek and to search out by wisdom all that is done under heaven; it is an unhappy business that God has given to human beings to be busy with. I saw all the deeds that are done under the sun; and see, all is vanity and a chasing after wind.

I hated all my toil in which I had toiled under the sun, seeing that I must leave it to those who come after me – and who knows whether they will be wise or foolish? A reading from the Letter of Paul to the Colossians

Colossians 3.1-11

If you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory.

Put to death, therefore, whatever in you is earthly: fornication, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed (which is idolatry). On account of these the wrath of God is coming on those who are disobedient. These are the ways you also once followed, when you were living that life. But now you must get rid of all such things anger, wrath, malice, slander, and abusive language from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have stripped off the old self with its practices and have clothed yourselves with the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge according to the image of its creator. In that renewal there is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave and free; but Christ is all and in all!

Sermon

The Creed

RESTART A HEART



It's wonderful that modern technology has produced a device, available to the public, that can re-start a heart if someone has a heart attack, giving them the best possible chance of survival. These defibrillators are automated and can be used by people without medical training.

At the suggestion of our Hall Committee, the PCC is now planning to purchase a defibrillator, and a cabinet for it to go in. Sited on the outside wall of the Hall, the cabinet will be unlocked so that it is accessible to the public as well as to folk visiting the Hall and the Church. It will be registered with the local ambulance service so that they can direct a caller to the device before the ambulance arrives.

The PCC is looking into possible grants to help fund the device and its cabinet and to cover the small running costs that will be incurred. We thought that the congregation might also like the opportunity to support this worthwhile venture. The PCC welcomes donations towards the total cost which is estimated at £1,900.

If you would like to donate, you can use electronic means – in Church or via the Saint John's website. Please let us know via the Parish Office that you intend this to be for the defibrillator. If donating by cheque, please make it payable to St John's PCC and mark the cheque on the back "Defibrillator".

Unlike most things we buy, we sincerely hope we will never have to use this defibrillator! But if the need arises we will have done our best to provide help in a desperate situation.



An update from **Hastings Foodbank**.

"In June we gave out 853 food parcels which is the equivalent of 17,913 meals! The cost of this is staggeringly £18,000! The need for the Foodbank is likely to increase rapidly come the autumn. Hastings Foodbank is a Trussell Trust Foodbank which means that clients require a voucher to access food. This enables the referrer to signpost the client for additional help depending on the reason they are in crisis. Over the next few months we are hoping to have a dedicated advisor to work with clients to ensure they are getting the best support possible. Thank you to all those churches who collect food donations for us and / or make financial donations, and for the volunteers from churches across the town. We are extremely grateful!"
